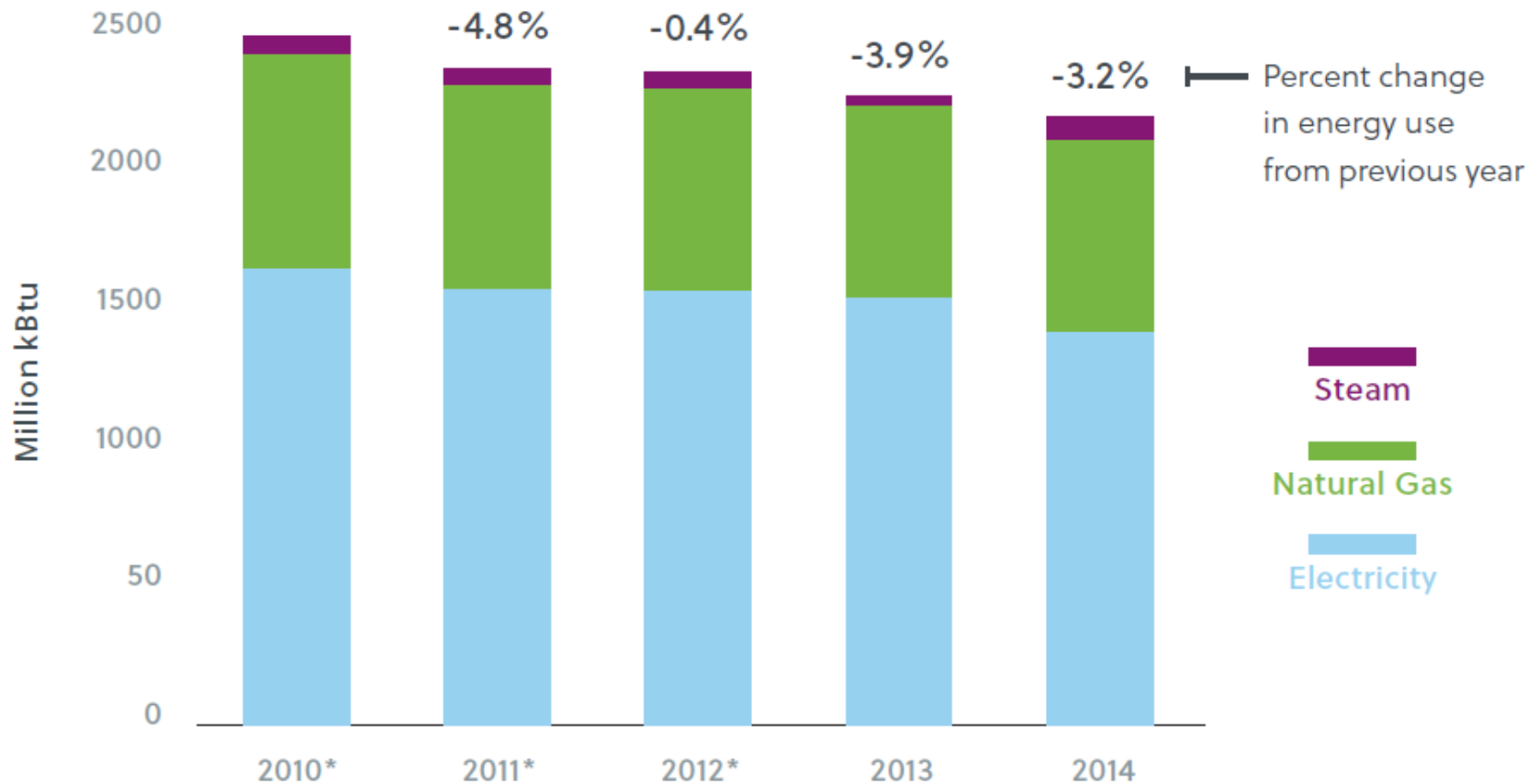
- 465 buildings, 49M sq feet

an annual average reduction of 3%

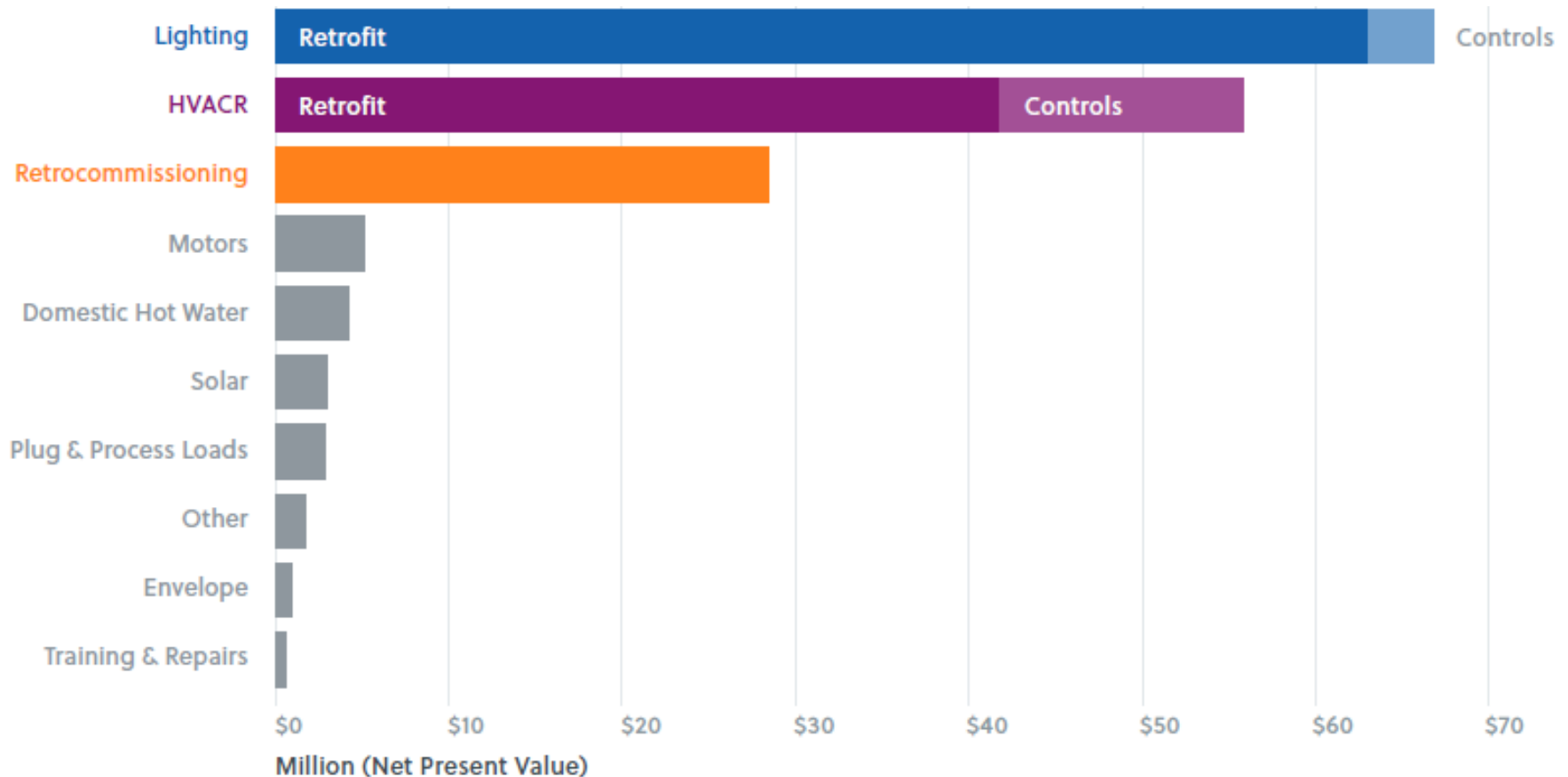

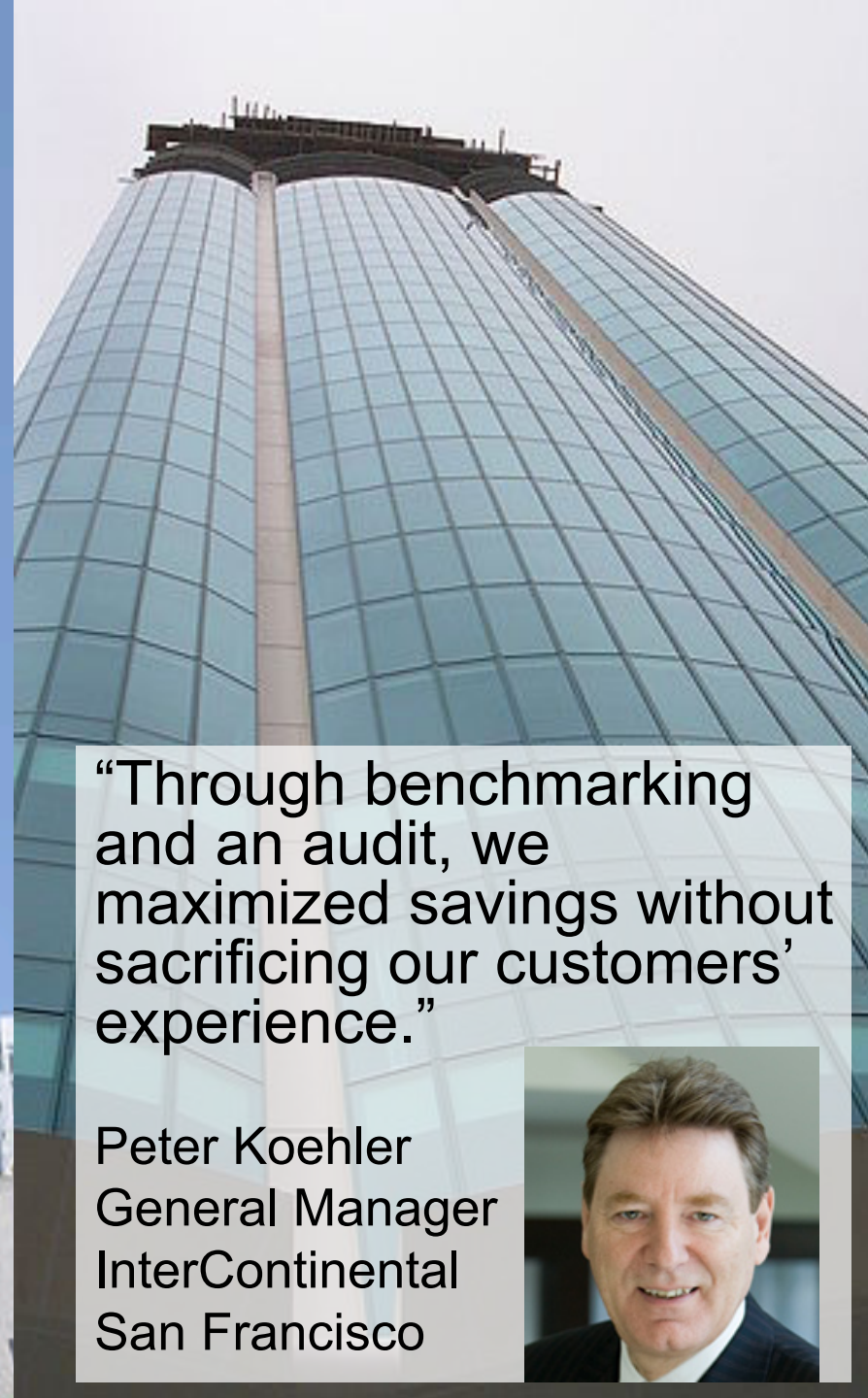

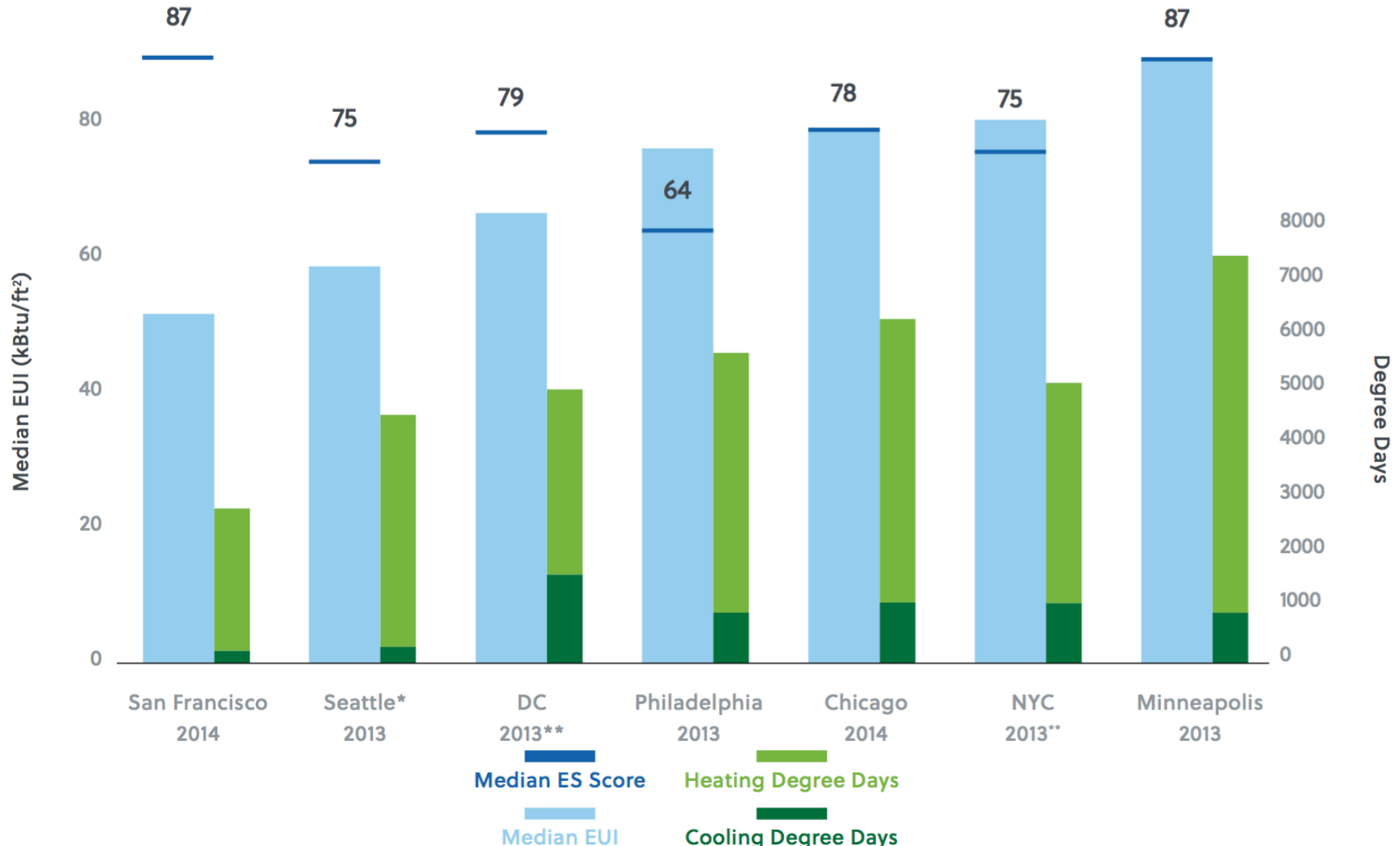
Energy Use and Economic Growth: Decoupled

total employed increased 11% and energy use declined 2%
