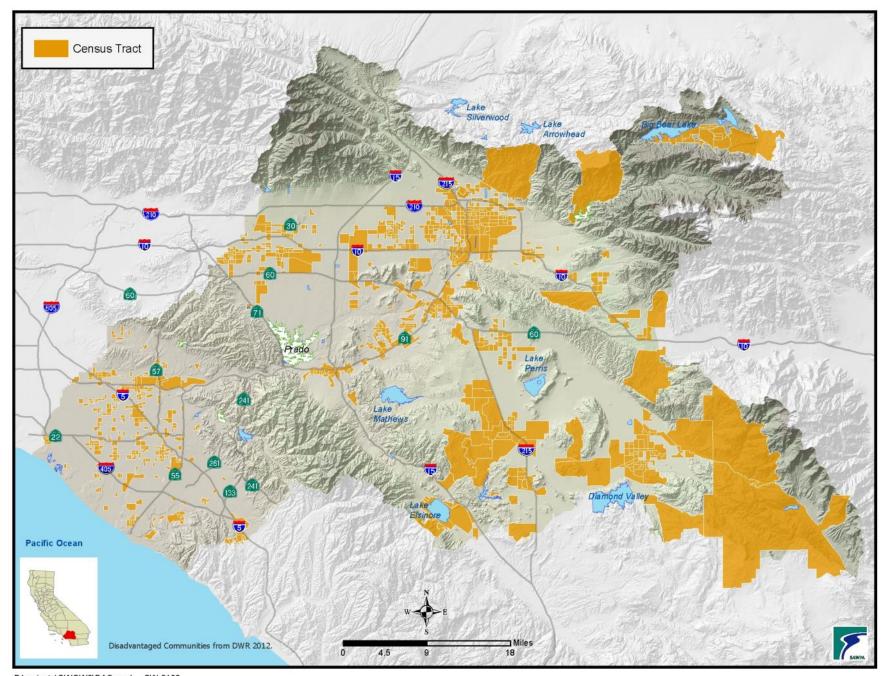
- Scope
 - Removing and replacing
 - thirsty landscapes
 - inefficient indoor plumbing
 - Focused on communities
 identified by CalEnviroscreen
 - Strengthening engagement











- Goals
 - Retrofit 260,000 sqft turf
 - Retrofit indoor hot- and coldwater devices
 - NO COST TO RESIDENTS

Strengthened engagement









- Outcomes:
 - 23 million gallons saved per year
 - 3 million kwh saved per year
 - ~300 more homes with native landscapes
 - landscape maintenance training
 - New relationships
 - New (strengthened) ethos









(Social) Resilience

- Most frequently a conceptual frame around infrastructure and technical systems
- More importantly though it is a social concept describing people and communities
- Social networks yield social capital, an investment in resilience

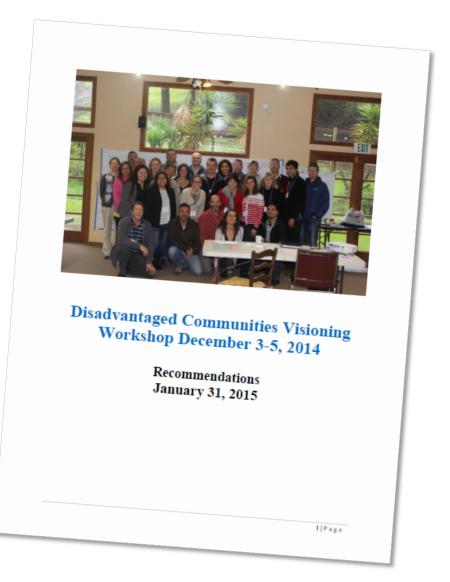
















Study conclusions

Engagement Model:

- 1. Community-Led Engagement
 - Needed: institutions enhance their attentiveness
- 2. Institution-Led Project Outreach
 - Needed: more individualized engagement strategies
- 3. Institution-Led Community Needs Assessment
 - Needed: continued commitment to engagement activities

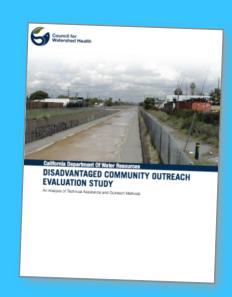

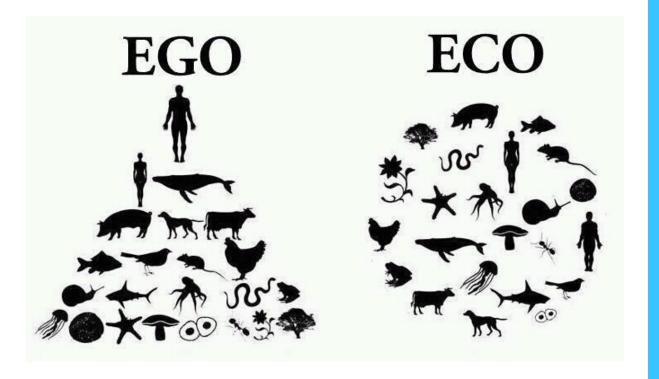
Inclusiveness and Sensitivity:

- Experts in communications and community members must develop conscientious language and guidance.
 - "Dacks" reaffirms barriers and differences
 - Reframing from "DACs" to "members of disadvantaged communities" is necessarily part of engagement.
